# Welcome to Ski Camp

The purpose of ski camp is to offer the Scouts of Troop 605 with the opportunity to fellowship together as they work on merit badges that often involve water and/or water craft. There is no cost for active scouts to attend **IF** they have participated in at least 2 road side clean ups and/or the work day at the lake house. All others are required to pay \$5.00 per day to assist with the costs. Food and “extras” like ice, bait, snacks, etc. are the financial responsibility of the participant.

Ski Camp provides an excellent **opportunity** to work on the following water related merit badges:

- Motor Boating
- Canoeing
- Rowing
- Swimming\*
- Water Skiing
- Fishing

In addition, scouts are encouraged to work on:

- Camping\*
- Physical Fitness\*
- Rank Attainment (still need to get stuff checked off for First Class? This is the place to do it!).
- Cooking
- Join the Ski Club
- Join the Mile Swim Club
- Join the Knee Boarding Club

\* Denotes Merit Badges that are Required for Advancement to the Rank of Eagle

If Scouts are interested in pursuing any other merit badge, please speak to an adult leader. We will be more than glad to help in any possible way!

## What Do I Need To Bring?

## Sleeping “Accommodations”

Due to limited tent space on the Lake Lure property, we ask that troop tents be used. Once scouts have been assigned a partner from their patrol, they should see the Troop Quarter Master or Scout Master to check out their tent. The troop also has a limited supply of cooking equipment, including stoves, available for check out. If you need to borrow these items, please see the Quarter Master or Scout Master. All troop equipment should be returned in (at least) the condition it was received...clean, in good repair and where applicable, organized.

Scouts who have attained the rank of *Life or above* may sleep inside the ski house.\*\* All other scouts are required to sleep in troop tents in the designated camping area. **NOTE:** Per Don Henderson’s instructions, no person will be allowed to sleep inside the hydro dine boat house until further notice is given.

\*\*The Scout Master (or the Senior Patrol Leader with the permission of the Scout Master) may approve other arrangements based on individual circumstances.

## What about Food?

The troop keeps a supply of charcoal on hand at the ski house for scouts to use to cook their meals. We also have a small supply of propane stoves that may be checked out for use by the scouts. Limited refrigeration space is available, and is therefore reserved for the most perishable items. Please ensure that each item (regardless of where you store it) has the owner’s name written on it in permanent marker. Coolers should be used for drinks and other items. Mr. Henderson makes at least one trip to the store daily to replenish ice for the coolers IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY to let him know if you need more ice! You will be asked to pay for your ice, so bring extra money, please.

Each patrol is responsible for deciding whether they will be cooking as a patrol, in pairs or as individuals. We strongly urge Scouts to consider cooking in patrols. It provides an opportunity for meeting the requirements of the Cooking Merit Badge and for meeting the rank requirements for those seeking First Class or below.

### **Please plan to join us on Wednesday, June 20<sup>h</sup> at 6:00 PM for an evening of family fun!**

Each year, in keeping with the tradition of Troop 605, ski camp is brought to a close with an evening of family fellowship, swimming and recognitions. Each family is asked to contribute a salad, dessert or side dish **AND** something to drink. The troop provides the main course and the paper products. You will be contacted regarding your contribution. **Don’t forget your lawn chair and swim suit!**

*Leca Harris has been kind enough to agree to organize the dinner this year. If she has not been able to reach you, please contact her to tell her how many people from your family will be joining us for dinner and which side dish or dessert you will bring. This should be taken care of no later than Friday, June 15.*

**Note:** *Swim test rule applies to parents, siblings and any other person wishing to swim or use the watercraft.*

# Who's Who?

**...And who are YOU?**

**Waterfront Director:** Adult Assistant Scout Master in charge of **ALL** waterfront & water related activities. **Safety is his first and foremost concern and his decisions are final.**

**Scout Master:** An adult leader. Oversees and assists Instructors and Scouts in any situation that may require assistance.

**Additional Leaders:** Assistant Scout Masters, Committee Members, Parents, etc. who have **volunteered** their time to ensure that your week at ski camp is both safe and enjoyable. Please respect their authority. If you have a problem with their decision, take it to the Waterfront Director or the Scout Master.

**Instructor:** A Scout of 1<sup>st</sup> Class or above. Instructs and assists in **ALL** activities and events. Counselors report to the assigned Scout Master/Adult.

**Senior Patrol Leader:** Scout entrusted with the task of leading the program.

**Assistant SPL:** Assists the SPL and serves in the capacity of the SPL during his absence.

**Participant:** Any Scout who is registered and eligible to participate in the activities set for ski camp.

## **WITH REGARD TO THE DOMESTIC STAFF..**

*Please Note: The maids, cooks and other domestic help have, unfortunately, resigned. Therefore, **you** will be responsible for your own meals, your own property and for cleaning up after yourself. Sorry for any inconvenience this may cause...*



# ***RULES AND REGULATIONS***

**A scout is trustworthy, loyal, helpful, friendly, courteous, kind, obedient, cheerful, thrifty, brave, clean and reverent.**

Above is the law that each scout promised to obey. If each scout conducts himself in accordance with the scout law, and encourages his peers to do the same, behavior problems will not exist. **SAFETY** is our primary concern, and as such, **any infractions will be met with the following consequences:**

1. Verbal Warning
2. Conference with Water Front Director or Scout Master
3. If needed, based on Water Front Director and/or Scout Master's discretion, Scout's parents will be called to pick him up from camp.

## **Other Enforced Policies to be Aware of:**

Rules regarding the use of the swimming area and boats will be discussed, in detail, with the Scouts on the first day of camp during orientation. The summary of which consists of the following:

- All scouts, regardless of age or ability will be required to take the swim test on the first day of camp. You must take the swim test again, even if you have already taken it somewhere else. If you fail the swim test, you must use a life-jacket at all times when you are in the water until you **DO** pass the swim test. Swimming instruction and additional opportunities to pass the test will be given during camp.
- All Scouts are expected to **FAITHFULLY** use the **BUDDY BOARD**, whether swimming, boating or on land. When a buddy call is issued, you **MUST** know where your buddy is, and you **MUST** be able to get to him quickly!
- Boat operators **are responsible for:** listing their boats time of departure and expected return on the dry erase board in the boat house, making certain that **each scout "signs out"**, before boarding and upon return, boat operator should ensure that each scout erases his name.
- In general, Scouts must be 16 years old or older, have attained the rank of Life, have (in their possession) a valid driver's license and the permission of the Scout Master before they will be allowed to operate motorized water craft without an approved leader present in the boat.
- Star Scouts and above may operate the John Boat in the lagoon as long as they have earned the Motor Boat Merit Badge **AND** have the Waterfront Director or Scout Master's permission.
- **Scouts who do not meet the criteria above are not to leave the lagoon area without the permission of the Scout Master.**
- Kayaks, Fun-yaks, the Jon Boat and Canoes do not leave the lagoon area without the Waterfront Director or Scout Master's permission.
- Swimming should only happen in the designated "swimming area." **ABSOLUTELY** no swimming in the "cove with the rope swing" without adult supervision!!!
- **Life Jackets MUST** are to be worn at all times while in boats, kayaks and canoes. They must be worn at all times by skiers and "tubers" being pulled by a boat. They must also be worn at all times by non-swimmers, or those who have not passed the swim test. **No Exceptions!**
- No throwing of sand, mud or rocks in the lake or on land.

- Be respectful of our neighbors...please stay within the boundaries of the ski-house property, and keep your camping sites neat and orderly.
- **Parents, by allowing your scout to participate in ski camp, you imply your agreement to be financially responsible for the repairs or replacement costs of any equipment that is damaged due to negligence or misuse.**

Lastly, while we understand that “boys will be boys,” remember that you are representing your family and our Troop. Remember that old saying? The one that says “if you have to ask whether it is wrong or right, then it is probably wrong?” Stick with that notion and err on the side of caution. If you aren’t comfortable telling your pastor or your Granny, then you probably ought not do whatever it is that you’re thinking about doing!

### **The following will be enforced in accordance with BSA policy:**

“Physical violence, hazing, bullying, theft, verbal insults, drugs and alcohol have no place in the Scouting program...The Boy Scouts of America prohibits the use of alcoholic beverages and controlled substances at encampments or activities on property owned and/or operated by the Boy Scouts of America or at any activity involving participation of youth members.

Use of tobacco products by Scouts is PROHIBITED. Adult leaders should support the attitude that young adults are better off without tobacco and may not allow the use of tobacco products at any BSA activity involving youth participants. All Scouting functions, meetings and activities are to be conducted on a tobacco free basis...The Troop promotes a program that is based on appropriate behavior and mutual respect. Therefore, the following items/actions are prohibited from all BSA activities for Scouts AND adults:

- Pornographic Materials
- Open Blade Sheath Knives
- Any Knife Without the Possession of the “Totin’ Chip” (scouts only)
- Striking or Pushing Another Individual
- Lying
- Name Calling, Negative Remarks About Another’s Religion, Ethnic Background, or Unfriendly Behavior (“I was kidding” is **not** justification for such behavior)
- Stealing (which includes intentionally “hiding” an item)
- Damaging Property of Another Person or Troop
- Any Action Which Endanger the Safety of Others
- Use of Tobacco Products or alcohol
- Other Areas which are Not Scout Like.”
